
### E-town Child Care Chronicle

#### Some Safety Reminders

#### **September Recap**

We learned about farms and harvesting crops, and enjoyed talking about farm animals, vehicles, gathering crops, and eating delicious foods. We read about farms, farmers, and foods. We did a lot of gross motor activities this month, working on crawling, rolling, climbing, and sitting, standing, and cruising. We enjoyed the beautiful autumn weather when we went outside.

#### **Personal Achievements**

**Simon** is beginning to stand independently, and squatting to play with toys. One of his favorite activities is throwing and rolling a ball to his teachers and to his friends, waiting excitedly for them to roll it back to him. Simon enjoys playing with the toy foods and kitchen, putting foods into the pots and pans and turning the knobs on the stove.

**Boden** has gone quickly from crawling on his tummy to suddenly pulling up to stand at any opportunity he gets. He enjoys being able to explore some toys he couldn't reach before, and he is very skilled at sitting himself back down from a standing position. Boden is really enjoying eating the foods from the toddler menu, and his self-feeding skills are improving daily.

Alijah has figured out how to pull up to stand at small tables and in his crib, and is working on learning to sit back down when he wants to move to a different location. He enjoys the book center, often standing behind the books and pulling them out one by one until it is empty. Alijah says several words including mama, dada, baba, and numnum.

Connor is scooting all over the room now, and sometimes gets up on his hands and knees and rocks back and forth in an effort to learn to crawl. He loves being able to move around the room to explore toys that his friends have put on the floor for him, especially pop-up toys. Connor is working on sitting up independently to play, getting better balanced every day.

**Looking Ahead:** In October, we will learn about autumn. We will read and sing songs about leaves



falling, cooler weather and Halloween. We will work on our gross motor skills like cruising, walking, scooting, crawling, rolling, and sitting with or without support. We are

going to do some painting and coloring. We will continue to work on our fine motor skills, learning to hold our bottles, self-feeding, and learning and using signs and words.
